Remark 2	1. This form is applicable to students enrolled in the Master's program in the 114th academic year. 2. The number of courses and credits taken in each of the first four semesters of the master's program shall not be less than 2 credits and not more than 14 credits. 3. Students of the Master's program must pass the oral examination of the Master's degree thesis before graduation and obtain 6 credits of required professional credits. 4. The minimum number of credits for graduation is 37 credits (including 10 credits of required courses, 6 credits of master's thesis, and at least 21 credits of professional electives). 5. Students who are admitted to the university in accordance with Article 7 of the Criteria for the Recognition of Equivalent Academic Qualifications for Admission to Universities, which states that students must demonstrate outstanding achievement in their field, are required to take at least 6 credits of remedial courses, which must be approved by the supervising professors and the head of the institute (department), and will not be counted as credits for graduation from the master's program. ear. 6. Professional electives are courses that are common to both the first and second year of study.
